

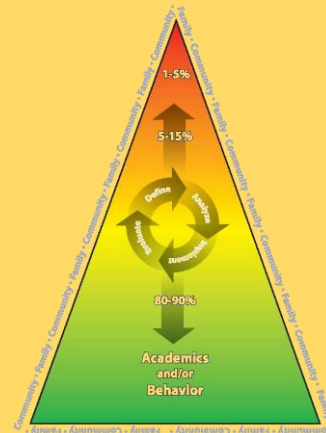
Crestwood School PBIS

Crestwood supports a safe and effective learning environment by establishing clear expectations for behavior that are taught, modeled and reinforced across all settings and by all staff.

What is PBIS?

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a proactive approach for establishing the behavioral supports and social culture needed for all students to achieve social, emotional, and academic success.

As a Response to Intervention model, PBIS applies a three-tiered system of support, and a problem-solving process to enhance the capacity of schools to effectively educate all students.



PBIS at Crestwood School

At the start of the year all students are taught the Eagle Expectations. Students participate in mini lessons in different areas of the school in order to learn what is expected of them.

Eagle Eyes

Students in preschool through eighth grade are rewarded with an Eagle Eye for displaying proper behavior. In the preschool through third grade, students who receive an Eagle Eye put their name on a classroom grid. Each Friday a section of the grid is called and a small reward is given to the student whose name is in that section. In 4th through 8th grade, students save their Eagle Eyes and purchase items at a monthly store.
