Eagle Expectation: Give Respect

Name of the Setting/Skill: Cafeteria – Keep hands, feet, and other objects to self

SEL Standard: 2C.1b. Demonstrate appropriate social and classroom behavior

Purpose of the Lesson:

1. To maintain an environment that is safe and orderly
2. To be respectful to others

Teaching Examples:

1. You are in the lunchroom and your table has been dismissed. You are walking down to empty your tray when one of the students sitting at the table sticks his foot out and you trip, spilling your tray. You start to get mad, but you STOP and THINK. *I don't want to get into trouble – I didn't do anything.* Just then a supervisor comes over and you tell her what happened. The student who tripped you gets in trouble and you go out for recess.
2. You are in the lunchroom eating at the table. You notice a classmate taking his food and throwing it at another student. You know that throwing food is not an appropriate behavior. You raise your hand to let the supervisor know that a rule has been broken.

Kids Activities/Role Play:

1. Role-play Teaching Examples 1 and/or 2.
2. Practice carrying a tray without bumping into others.

Follow-up Reinforcement Activities:

1. Reinforce expected behavior with Eagle Eyes.
2. Verbally compliment students for good behavior.
3. Before you leave your classroom for lunch, ask a few students ways they can remember to follow the Eagle Expectations.
