Eagle Expectation: Give Respect

Name of the Setting/Skill: Hallway – Quiet Voices

SEL Standard: 2C.1b. Demonstrate appropriate social and classroom behavior

Purpose of the Lesson:

1. To maintain an environment that is safe, quiet and orderly.
2. To get from one place to another quickly and quietly.
3. To be respectful of other classes by using responsible behavior.

Teaching Examples:

1. You see your friends, sisters or brothers in the hallway. You want to say hi, but you know you shouldn't make a noise. You wave and smile.
2. The class has worked very hard on their art projects. They are displayed on the walls in the hallway. You are very proud of your work. You want others to walk by and look at your project quietly.
3. Your class is waiting in the hall to go to lunch. There are other classes in front of you. It is frustrating, but you know that you need to be patient and wait quietly.

Kids Activities/Role Play:

1. Role-play Teaching Examples 1, 2, and/or 3.
2. Have small groups of students walk down the hall communicating with each other non-verbally. Then have a group of students walk down the hall communicating verbally. Discuss which is the appropriate way to communicate in the hall and why.

Follow-up Reinforcement Activities:

1. Reinforce expected behavior with Eagle Eyes.
2. Praise verbally.
