**Eagle Expectation:** Act Responsibly

**Name of the Setting/ Skill:** Hallways – Go Straight to Where You Are Going

**SEL Standard:** 3B.1b. Make positive choices when interacting with classmates.

### **Purpose of the Lesson:**

1. To maintain an environment that is safe, quiet, and orderly
2. To get from one place to another quickly and quietly
3. To be respectful of other classes

### **Teaching Examples:**

1. Your teacher sends you to the office with a note. You decide to get a drink and go to the restroom on your way to the office. Because you don't return your classroom in a timely manner, your teacher is concerned about your whereabouts. She contacts the office and finds that you are just arriving. Your teacher reminds you that "you need to go straight to where you are going."
2. Your class is going to an assembly. You are walking in the back of the line and notice that your art project is on display by the office. You stop to look at it. The class moves on ahead. You are now late for the assembly and miss the magic trick at the beginning. Then you remember that you should always "go straight to where you are going."

### **Kids Activities/Role Play:**

1. Use teaching example #1 to discuss the importance of why you should go straight to where you are going.
2. Have students role-play teaching example #2.

### **Follow-up Reinforcement Activities:**

1. Reinforce expected behavior with an Eagle Eye.
2. Praise students who go straight to where they are going.
