Eagle Expectation: Act Responsibly

Name of the Setting/ Skill: Media Center – Return Borrowed Books on Time

SEL Standard: 2C.1b. Demonstrate appropriate social and classroom behavior

Purpose of the Lesson:

1. To make materials available to others.
2. To show responsibility for borrowed items.

Teaching Examples:

1. You check out a really neat book from the library. Your due date to return the book back to school is coming up. You are not done reading the book. You decide you will keep the book until you are done reading it. Then you think, *I can just take the book to the library and renew it. That way the librarian knows I am responsible with the school's books.*
2. You are finished reading a book that you have checked out from the library. You are getting ready to return it when a friend sees it and asks to borrow it. You are tempted to let your friend borrow the book. Then you remember that the book is due back to the library the next day. You tell your friend that you must return the book, and he can check it out from the library himself.

Kids Activities/Role Play:

1. Discuss where students may return library books when they are finished reading them.
2. Discuss with students why it is important to return borrowed books on time.

Follow-up Reinforcement Activities:

1. Praise students who return books on time.
